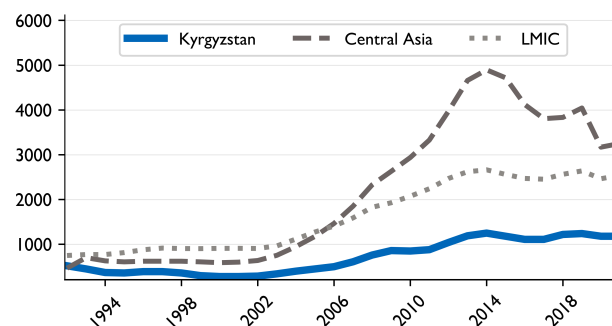

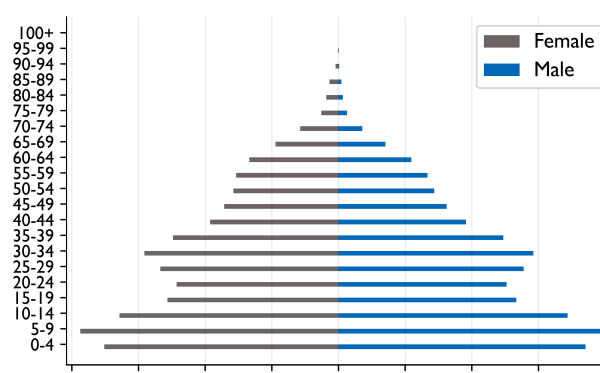

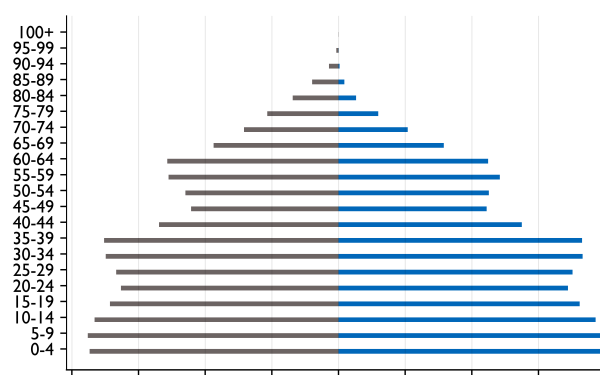
Income per capita, US\$



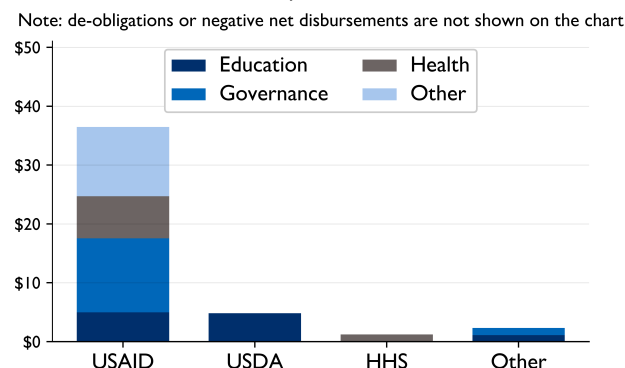
2022 Population

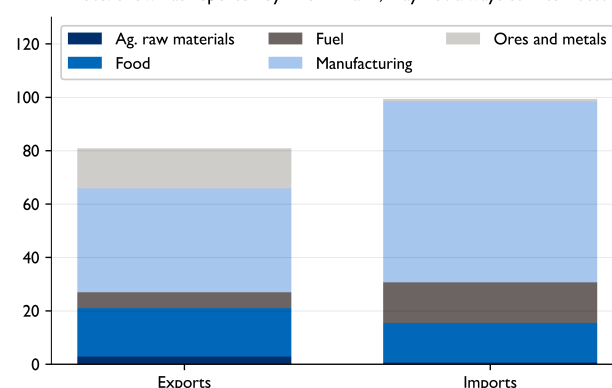

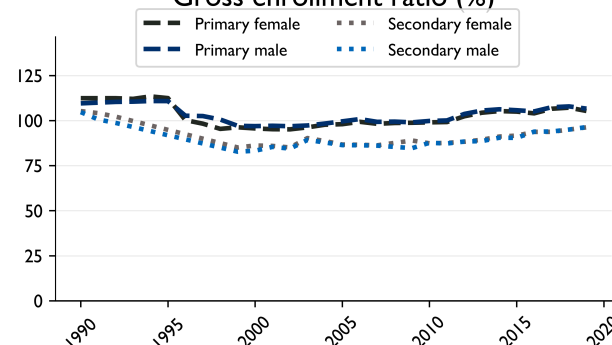

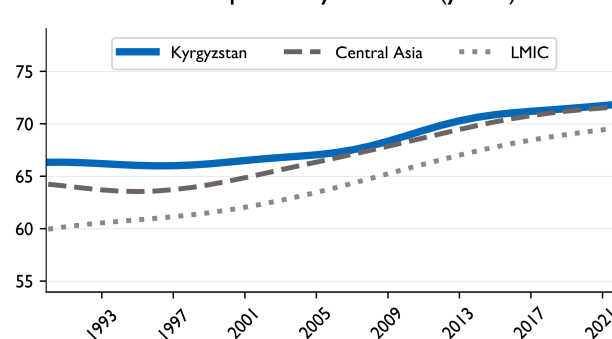

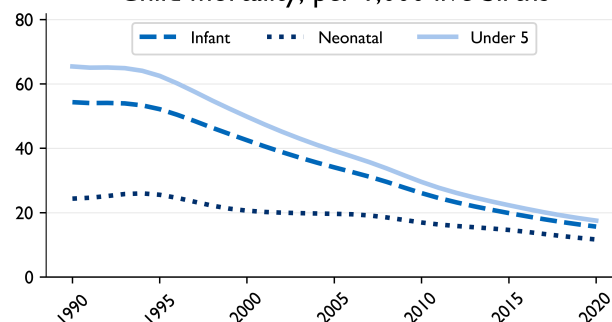
Gross enrollment ratio (%)
